

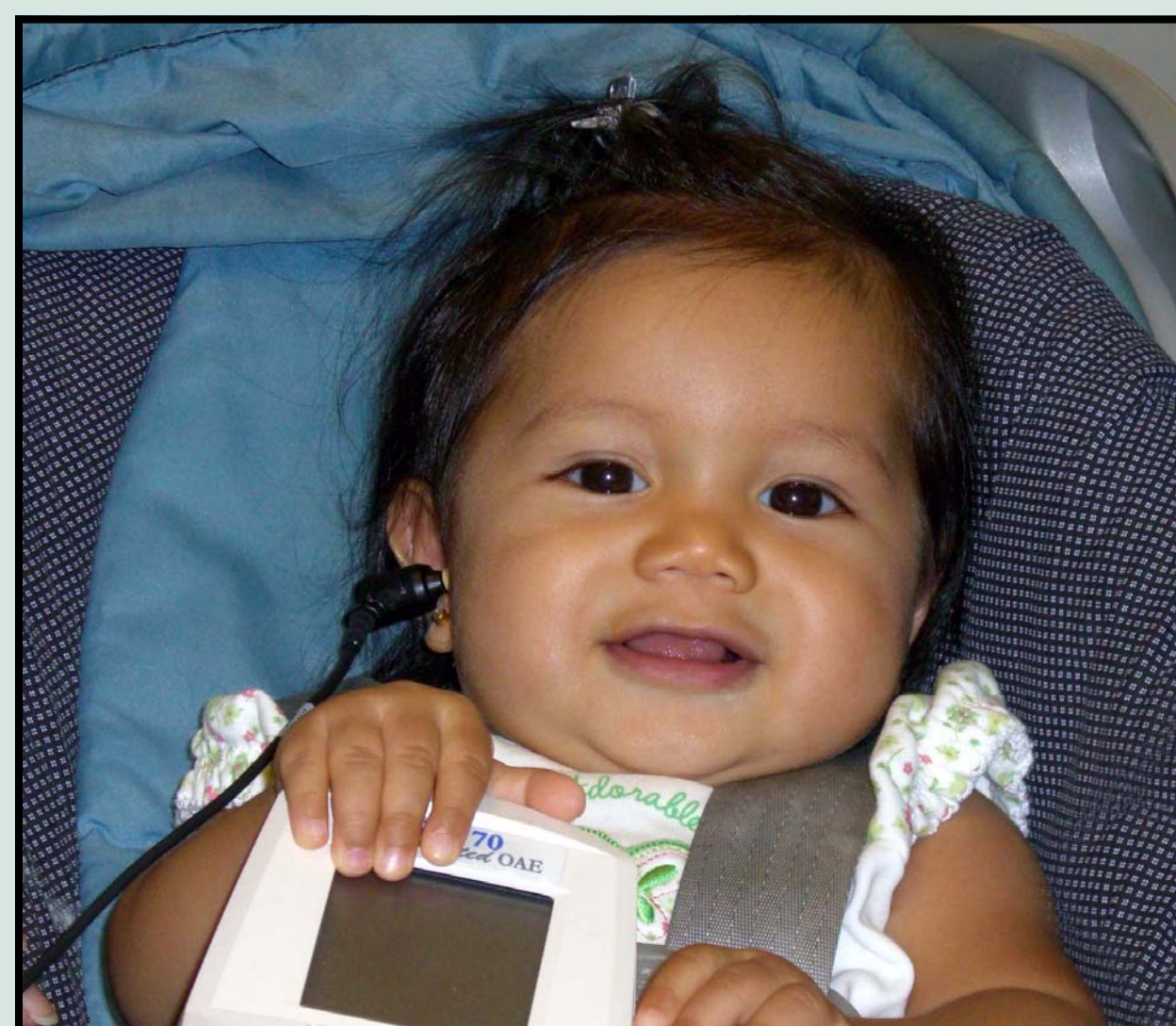
Is Your Infant “At Risk” for Hearing Loss?

Has your **baby experienced** one or more of the following “risk factors” by 6 months of age?

- Family concerned regarding hearing, speech, language or delay in development.
- Family history of permanent childhood hearing loss.
- Born before or during the 30th week of pregnancy.
- Birth weight was less than 3 lbs.
- Experienced a lack of oxygen after birth.
- Needed a machine to help him/her breathe.
- Spent 48 hours or more in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).
- Head, face, or ears shaped or formed in a different way than usual.
- Head injury.
- Infection that was present at birth or shortly after birth.
- Jaundice (hyperbilirubinemia) needing special procedure (exchange transfusion).
- Was given medicine that may damage hearing.
- Illness that might result in hearing problems.
- Frequent ear infections (more than four episodes in one year).
- Chemotherapy
